5 steps to the new you

We know that making such a personal and potentially life-enhancing decision isn't easy. But don't worry, we're here to help and we always set aside plenty of time to discuss your plans with you. Here's a simple, step-by-step guide to what happens when you choose a Nuffield Health Hospital for your procedure:

Step 1 – Contact us

When you take the first step and contact us, you'll be in touch with one of our dedicated team at our local Advice Centre. Telephone **0330 311 4548** or use our online enquiry form for a call back. Staff in our Advice Centre know about all our procedures and can help answer any questions.

You can also arrange to speak to one of our cosmetic nurses if you need further guidance. Alternatively they can let you know about the next free cosmetic surgery open event at your nearest Nuffield Health Hospital.

Step 2 – Your consultation appointment

Choosing your surgeon is one of the most important decisions you have to make. It's essential that you have the guidance of a qualified surgeon if you're thinking about any kind of treatment or surgery on your skin, face or body. It is important to discuss your options for treatment with your surgeon, including any non-surgical alternatives. Make sure that your surgeon is a member of the General Medical Council (GMC), and associated with the appropriate professional organisations such as the British Association of Aesthetic Plastic Surgeons (BAAPS) or the British Association of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons (BAPRAS).

Step 3 – Booking your procedure

Booking a procedure is simple. Just telephone the hospital or your surgeon's secretary and they will book a time to suit you. Your hospital will then send you details of the hospital's admission arrangements and any other documentation that you will be required to complete.

Feel free to call the hospital with any questions you may have during this process.

Step 4 – Preparing for your operation

Prior to your admission, you may be asked to come to the hospital for a pre-operative assessment with a nurse. At this appointment, the nurse will explain what to expect when you come into hospital. You will be given the opportunity to ask any questions you may have or raise any concerns.

Normally you will be admitted to hospital on the day of your operation. If you are having a general anaesthetic or sedation, you will be asked not to eat anything six hours before surgery.

If you smoke, you should consider giving up six weeks before your operation. The longer you give up beforehand, the better. If you can't stop completely, cutting down will help.

It is important to tell your surgeon, anaesthetist and nurse about any medication you take. You may also be asked to stop taking the contraceptive pill or hormone replacement therapy for a short time. Your surgeon will be able to advise you.

Step 5 – After your surgery

After your operation, you'll see your surgeon to make sure everything is fine and you are happy with the outcome, as well as follow-up care to help with your recovery and ensure you stay happy. We'll also advise you on what you can and cannot do when you get home. And you'll be given a contact telephone number to ring at any time if you have any concerns.

Please arrange for someone to take you home the day you leave us as you will not be able to drive yourself home afterwards. Even if your surgery is done as a day case, you'll need transport home.

What are the risks and side effects of surgery?

Having cosmetic surgery can be a very positive experience. Complications are infrequent and usually minor. However, no surgery is without risk and it is important that you are given a clear picture.

General complications of any operation may include:

- Pain
- Bleeding
- Minor infection
- Unsightly scarring
- Blood clots (deep vein thrombosis)

All the risks will be discussed in detail at your consultation. However, if you have further questions or concerns, do not hesitate to discuss these with your surgeon. Decisions about cosmetic surgery should never be rushed. What happens at a cosmetic open event?

The majority of Nuffield Health Hospitals run regular cosmetic surgery open events, which are an introduction to the range of procedures that are available and a chance to meet the Consultants that practice at your local hospital. At some events, there is also the opportunity to have a mini advice session with a Consultant Surgeon or Specialist Cosmetic Nurse, that usually lasts 10 minutes. This is a great way to find out more about your suitability for a procedure without committing to a full consultation and ask any questions you may have. The next step would be to then have a full consultation appointment.

What happens at a cosmetic surgery consultation appointment?

A consultation appointment usually lasts around 30 – 40 minutes and takes place with a Consultant surgeon. Your Consultant will take a full medical history, examine you and discuss the procedure you're interested in. Your Consultant will also talk to you about the expected outcomes and risks of the procedure.

How much does a consultation cost?

The price of a consultation is a one-off fee paid to the Consultant. Prices vary depending on the Consultant you choose to see, and start from approximately £150. Your hospital will be able to give you an exact price.

What does the treatment price include?

You will be quoted an inclusive price for treatment that will not change. This will include your consultation fees, anaesthetist fees, hospital fees, any overnight stays, medication and take home drugs. It also includes all your follow-up appointments and aftercare.

Can I spread the cost?

Our financial partner, Zebra Health Finance, offers interest-free loans^{*} to help pay for all or part of your treatment. There is no deposit required and you simply pay back the cost of your treatment with 6 or 10 equal monthly payments, completely interest free.
